Facing the Truth

During the season of Lent, we will move from the outward journey we have read about in Acts to the inward journey as we walk with Jesus through his Passion as recorded in Matthew. We will also explore the people who play a prominent role in the narrative—the woman who anointed Jesus, the disciples (particularly Judas and Peter), Caiaphas (the Jewish high priest), and Pilate (the Roman governor). As we read and reflect on the text, we will be invited to “face the truth” about who Jesus is and what he did, the world we live in that influences us to want our will rather than God’s will, and ourselves and all in us that needs to be forgiven, healed, and transformed. Join us as we reflect on the truth of God’s word and engage in spiritual practices that help us to let go and let God so that we can more deeply experience the love of God, the grace of Christ, and power of the Holy Spirit.

Go Deeper this Lent with the Lenten Devotionals

Jesus’ words in the Gospel of Matthew encourage us to resist the temptation to make excuses, and instead respond to his invitation to allow the Spirit of Truth to free, sanctify, and transform us by the truth of God’s word. 
